LVI performed asbestos abatement, mold remediation, infection control, and installed fireproofing at San Francisco's occupied Veterans Affairs Medical Center.

Asbestos-containing piping, fittings, and other elements were remediated, packaged, and moved into a covered transport container in accordance with NESHAPs packaging requirement. Waste was double bagged and disposed of in an appropriate regulated area. Throughout, all abatement personnel wore half-face respirators with HEPA filters and organic vapor cartiridges.

Additionally, LVI removed 50,000 square feet of floor tile and associated mastic in accordance with California and Federal OSHA requirements, which requires full negative enclosure using a wet removal method and HEPA vacuuming. Materials were kept intact as much as possible and an infra-red heating device was used by trained personnel. Employees wore personal respirators, full body suits, hard hats and eye protection during the work and took a decontamination shower at the end of their shift.

In addition, 40,000 square feet of loading docks received new fireproofing. All work was completed on-time with no recordable incidents.
